Every member of an awardee group to receive medallions, presented by the Governor of South Australia.	Student led school group exhibiting outstanding citizenship skills and actions. The groups identified can be as a result of self-nomination or nomination by the school. The entry for the group category involves a submission (maximum of 500 words) relating to the activity of the nominated group. The submission is to contain supporting information as evidence of the impact of the group action, ie photographs and testimonials. A group is to consist of no less than 3 and no more than 5 student representatives.
