Since 1995 the SA Schools Constitutional Convention has given year 11 students a chance to learn and share their views on being an Australian citizen and the Australian Constitution. The 2023 Convention is presented by the Department for Education and the Parliament of South Australia.

This year's program includes:

- presentations by expert speakers
- a Q&A panel with Members of Parliament
- group workshops
- reflections on the double majority requirement
- a debate and mock referendum in the House of Assembly Chamber

Parliament House provides a unique venue for this learning experience with an optional tour on offer for students. Morning tea and lunch will be provided.

We encourage nominations for any year 11 students interested in civics, democracy and what it means to be an Australian citizen. Students do not need to be enrolled in or have completed any prerequisite subjects to attend.

Individual schools are responsible for seeking parent or caregiver consent and transport arrangements. Registered teachers and organisers from the Department for Education will be present. Schools are encouraged to provide supervision on the day.

Students taking part this year will be invited to apply to attend the 2024 National Schools Constitutional Convention, in Canberra, with travel, accommodation and meals provided.
