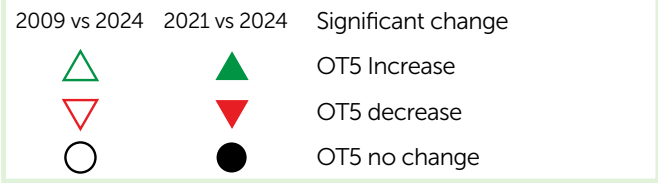
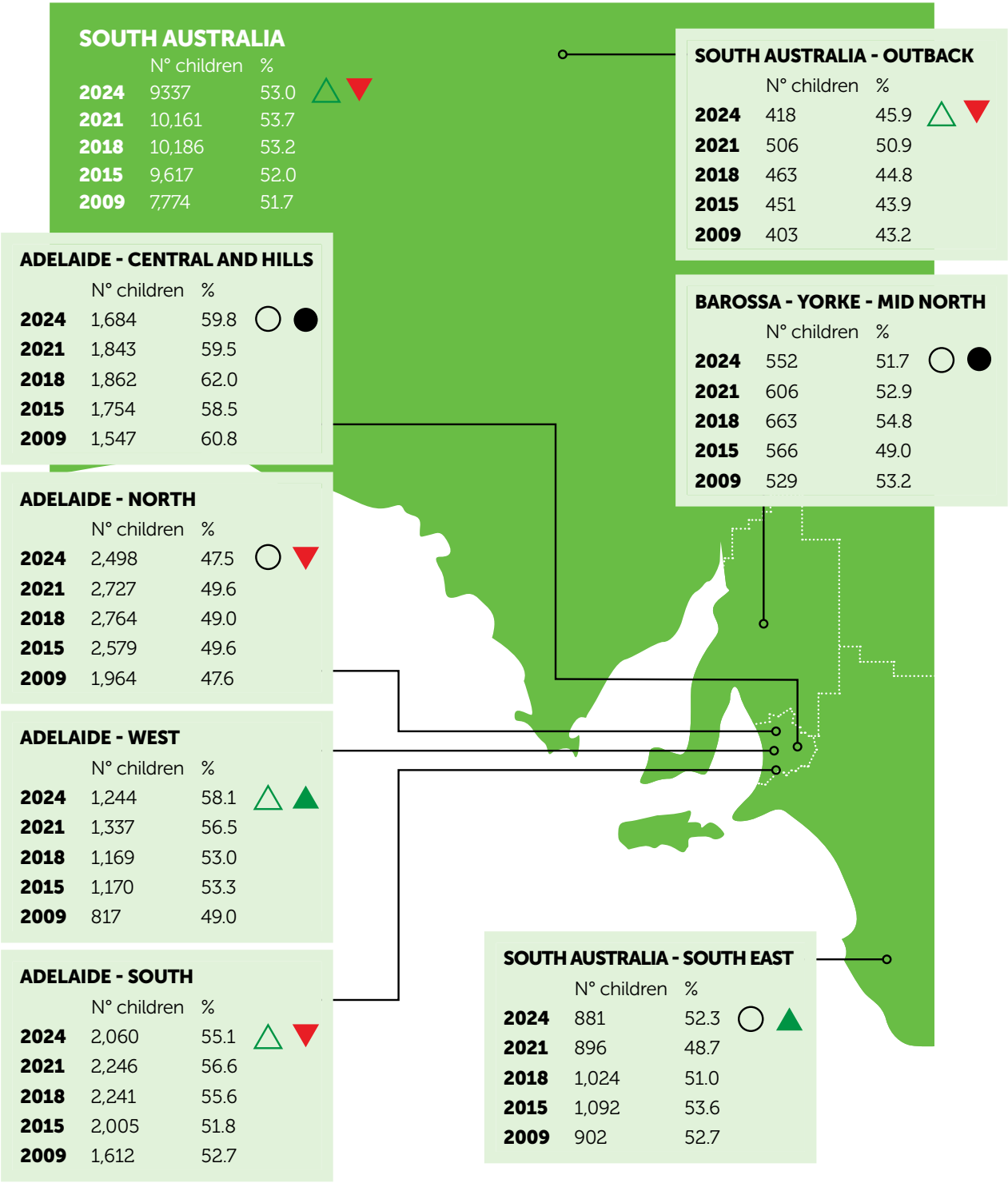


2024 AEDC South Australia map: sub-state regions (SA4)

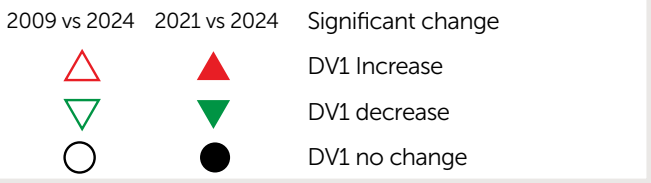
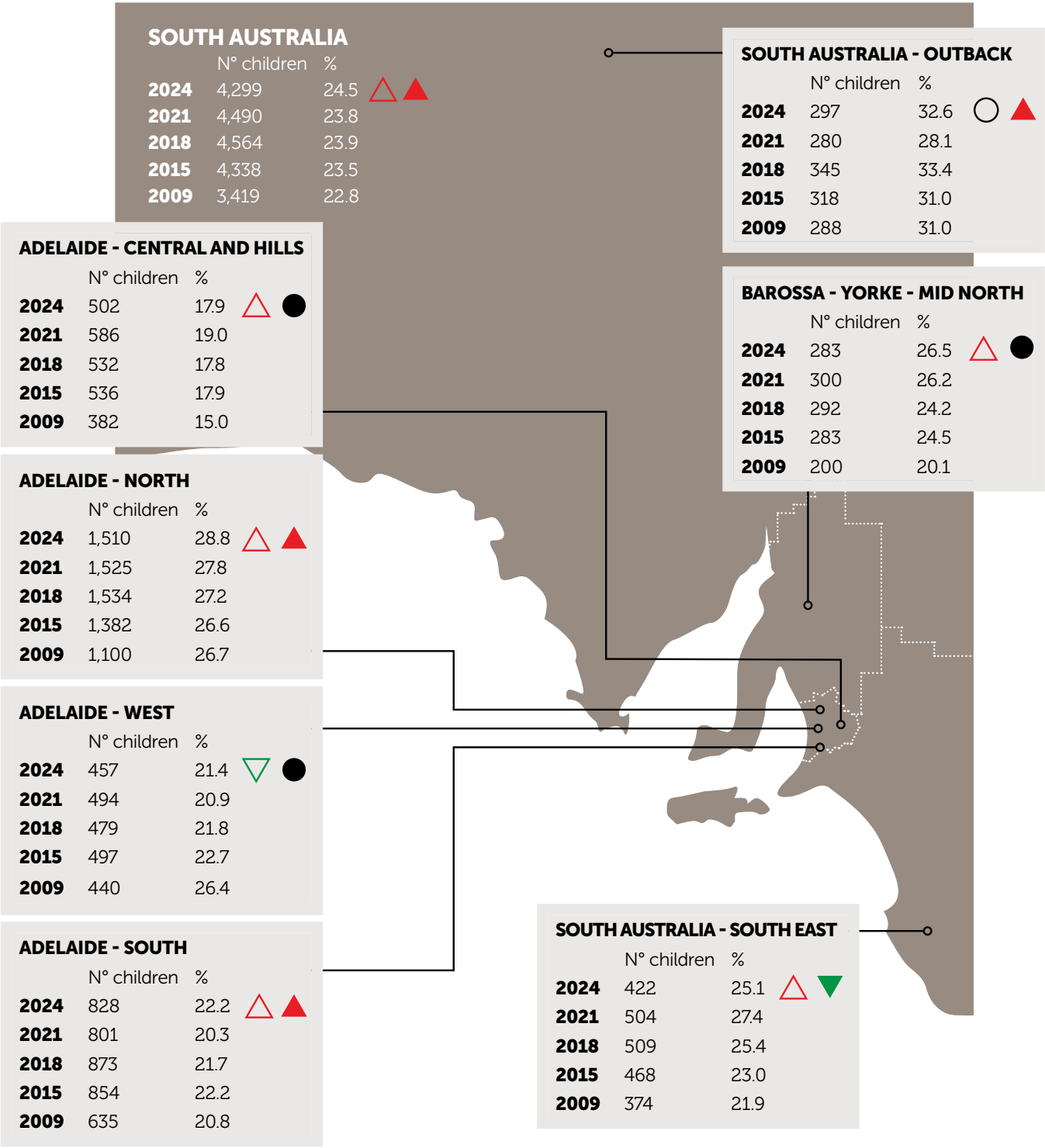
Developmentally on track on five domains (OT5)
