

Supporting Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) families to participate in education settings

Community Liaison Officers support participation of CALD families in education settings.

Community Liaison Officers:

- provide cultural awareness for education staff to develop their knowledge and understanding of diverse cultural backgrounds and experiences
- support the department sites to promote parent engagement and participation of CALD parents and caregivers in site-based activities
- work closely with CALD families to support their participation in the education setting including parent-teacher meetings, governing councils, parent group meetings and forums.

Supporting CALD families to understand the Australian education system

Community Liaison Officers support CALD families to understand the Australian education system.

CLOs provide information about:

- the importance of learning through play in the Early Years
- teaching and learning practices
- the curriculum, assessment and reporting policies and practices in preschools and schools
- Department policies, for example
 - » Countering Racism policy
 - » School Discipline policy
 - » Child Protection policy
- alternative pathways for the completion of the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

Supporting student retention, engagement and achievement

Community Liaison Officers support the retention, engagement and achievement of CALD children and young people.

Community Liaison Officers:

- work collaboratively with families, department services and community agencies to achieve positive outcomes for children and young people
- provide advice and support for individual cases
- raise awareness in CALD communities of:
 - » the expectations of children and young people in education sites
 - » everyday practices in the home that support child development and learning improvement
 - » the role of the department services and community agencies.
