Becoming a BSSO

- Interested applicant contacts the Project Assistant, English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EALD) Programs, Rosie D'Aloia at the Early Years and Child Development Division to request a BSSO Expression of Interest Form, telephone 8226 2756.
- 2. Applicant completes the Expression of Interest and returns it to Rosie D'Aloia, 15th Floor, Education Centre, 31 Flinders St, Adelaide 5000, email: Education.EALD@sa.gov.au
- 3. The Expression of Interest is kept on file for a period of two years from the date of receipt.
- 4. The applicant will be contacted to attend an interview when there is a need for a BSSO with his/her language skills. A date and time that suits both the interviewer and the interviewee will be set.
- 5. During the interview the applicant will be given 4 questions. The applicant will be left for 30 minutes to read the questions and make notes for personal use.
- 6. The interviewers will then ask each question in turn, giving the applicant as much time as needed to provide the answers.
- 7. The applicant will be given a typical school notice of no more than 150 words to translate into their first/other language. The applicant may take as much time as needed, write drafts and rewrite final copies, and use an English/Other Language dictionary to assist them.
- 8. The translation is then sent to a National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters (NAATI) accredited translation service for checking.
- 9. When the translation is returned to the EALD Program, the applicant is contacted and advised as to whether the interview and the translation test successfully met the criteria.
- 10. The BSSO will be required to submit a EDUjobs Employable Ancillary Register (EAR) On-Line Application:
 Prior to this applicants much have evidence of completing Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect Education and Care Training (RRHAN-EC) and a Department of Human Services (DHS) Working With Children employment screening. When approved, the applicant's name is added to the BSSO register.
- 11. Schools can then contact the BSSO to offer short term contracts. The details are entered online using the Vacancy Selection Placement (VSP) program
