## Process for deciding a winner

#### Premiership points

Two (2) points shall be awarded for a win, One (1) point for a draw None (0) for a loss.

### Final placings at the completion of round robin matches

- (a) To determine the final positions, teams shall be placed in descending order according to **the number of premiership points gained**.
- (b) (i) In the event of two teams gaining the same number of premiership points, the respective placings shall be decided by **the result of the match between the two teams concerned**.
  - (ii) If the two teams had a draw when they played each other, the respective placings shall be determined by **skins**.

#### Skins points

The corresponding batting pairs in each team (that is: partnership 1v1; 2v2; 3v3; 4v4) will compete for an additional point (known as a skins point) which will be given to the pair making the highest partnership. One skins point is offered for each corresponding pair, making a total of 4 skins points per game. A tied batting pair will jackpot the skins point forward to the next pair or backwards in the case of the last pair.

- (c) In the event of more than two teams gaining the same number of premiership points, the respective placings shall be determined by **skin difference** in all matched played
- (d) In the event of there still being a tie for any placing at the end of the Round Robin which cannot be resolved by applying all of the above, **the total run difference in all matches played between themselves** in the competition shall be placed higher. The reason for this is to eliminate the need to "kill" a non-competitive team in the competition.
- (e) In the event of there still being a tie for any placing at the end of the Round Robin which cannot be resolved by applying all of the above, the team scoring the most runs in all matches played between themselves shall be placed higher.
