## Process for deciding a winner

### Premiership points

Two (2) points shall be awarded for a win,

One (1) point for a draw

None (0) for a loss.

### Final placings at the completion of round robin matches

- (a) To determine the final positions, teams shall be placed in descending order according to **the number of premiership points gained**.
- (b)
  - (i) In the event of two teams gaining the same number of premiership points, the respective placings shall be decided by **the result of the match between the two teams concerned**.
  - (ii) If the two teams had a draw when they played each other, the respective placings shall be determined by **skins**.

### Skins points

The corresponding batting pairs in each team (that is: partnership 1v1; 2v2; 3v3; 4v4) will compete for an additional point (known as a skins point) which will be given to the pair making the highest partnership. One skins point is offered for each corresponding pair, making a total of 4 skins points per game. A tied batting pair will jackpot the skins point forward to the next pair or backwards in the case of the last pair.

- (c) In the event of more than two teams gaining the same number of premiership points, the respective placings shall be determined by **skin difference** in all matches played
- (d) In the event of there still being a tie for any placing at the end of the Round Robin which cannot be resolved by applying all of the above, **the total run difference in all matches played between themselves** in the competition shall be placed higher. The reason for this is to eliminate the need to “kill” a non-competitive team in the competition.
- (e) In the event of there still being a tie for any placing at the end of the Round Robin which cannot be resolved by applying all of the above, **the team scoring the most runs in all matches played between themselves** shall be placed higher.
