- Responsible for all financial matters relating to the tour.
- Overseeing of travel and accommodation details (working in conjunction with the School Sport SA). Liaise with parents/carers regarding travel and accommodation details confirm all details in writing.
- Assume a duty of care when the coach and team manager are required to attend official functions (ie opening and closing meetings, team dinner).
- Assist with the selection of the team.
- Keep parents/carers informed regarding uniform requirements.
- Stay in regular contact with uniforms suppliers to ensure that ALL team members and officials have ordered the compulsory uniform.
- Cleanliness of players' uniforms during the championship.
- Organising a menu for players and officials during the championship.
